

Taking the time to introduce your puppy to a wide range of experiences at a young age is an important step in helping him to grow into a well-mannered and happy companion. This checklist can be used as a scavenger hunt - and it will help you organize fun field trips for your puppy.

Here's how it works:

You can pick and choose what works best for you and your family. Check off each item as you complete it. You can choose whichever activities you wish - and you do not have to complete them in any particular order. I have included some space for you to include some things that may be specific to your situation or environment.

Be sure to bring lots of yummy treats for your puppy! Keep them small! Treat your puppy with each experience and if you are introducing your puppy to friendly strangers, you can ask them to give your puppy treats as well.

Stay focused on your puppy! Watch to ensure that they are enjoying themselves. If your puppy appears frightened (not taking treats, tail tucked, ears back or is pulling away) you may have tried to progress too quickly. Move away from the area/object to a safe distance where your puppy begins to relax again... this will likely be when they begin to take treats again. If you are unable to make progress, end the session and try another day. Always end things on a positive note with a game, special treat or toy!

Remember... go at your puppy's pace... not yours!
